The overall purpose of the online course is to give its participants orientation in the theoretical and practical dimensions of Gandhiji Life and philosophy; legacy; Gandhiji's thoughts to comprehend the concepts like Swaraj, Swadeshi, Satyagrah, Spirituality and Trusteeship as explained and applied by Mahatma Gandhi in his personal and public life. The course attempts to promote the Gandhian vision of peace, non-violence and purity of means and his concept of World Order for Global Peace. The course for the Indian diaspora and international participants will be in collaboration with Indian Mis-

sions and Indian Council for Cultural Relations as part of the commemoration of 75th Years of India's Independence - Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. From March 2021 to February 2022, we have completed eight online certificate courses hosted by 55 Indian Mission and ICCR. The participants from various countries have wholeheartedly taken part in the classes. This online course is aimed at enhancing the understanding of Indian spiritual and cultural heritage as well as the tremendous contribution made by Mahatma Gandhi during the century of his life was great indeed, his contribution in the next century when the world is facing many challenges could be even higher.

The courses will be conducted by Dr Shobhana Radhakrishna and her team. The course will be interactive and participatory and is a non-credit program. After completion of the course, participants will be given a digitally signed cer-

tification. The online course will be spread over four weeks-60 minutes once a week every Saturday's on a virtual platform.

Broad topics to be covered in four courses:

- ♦ Gandhian Philosophy of Truth, Non-violence, Sarvodaya, Satyagraha and Swaraj
- Transformational Leadership of Mahatma Gandhi, Gandhian Economics of Trusteeship
- Mahatma Gandhi's Spirituality, Wellness, Nature cure and Environmental credo
- Mahatma Gandhi's Ashrams, Khadi, Charkha, Swadeshi and Minimalistic living

Dr Shobhana Radhakrishna was born and brought up in Mahatma Gandhi's Ashram in Sevagram near Wardha in Maharashtra. She has cultivated a strong ideological connect with Mahatma Gandhi's ideals since childhood. For the past two decades, she has attempted different ways of spreading Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy to people in India and abroad by giving lectures, workshops and Gandhi Katha.

Dr. Radhakrishna has travelled to 42 countries and presented lectures and



Gandhi Katha. During the commemoration of the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi starting from 2018 to 2020, She has delivered an online Gandhi Katha hosted by Indian Missions accredited to 135 countries. Through the virtual medium, Gandhiji messages have reached wide and far and many Heads of Indian Missions have appreciated the efforts. On 30th January 2022, Indian Missions

accredited to 90 countries hosted the online tribute by Dr Radhakrishna to pay homage to

Background:

As a part of the worldwide celebration of the 150th Birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi since 2018, Dr Radhakrishna has delivered 267 lectures and Gandhi Katha hosted by Indian Missions accredited to 135 countries and facilitated by the Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Culture, Government of India. Through the virtual medium, Gandhiji messages have reached wide and far and many HOMs have appreciated the efforts. The Katha format is ingrained in the Indian culture, and it conveys the messages by way of storytelling with narration and music effectively.

Further, on 30th January 2022, Indian Missions accredited to 90 countries hosted the tribute by her to pay homage to Mahatma Gandhi on his 74th Martyr's Day on their social media sites. Indian Mission in 89 countries hosted the talk by Dr. Shobhana Radhakrishna on 12th March 2022 to commemorate the 92nd Anniversary of Salt Satyagraha.

Following the interest and awareness generated after the Gandhi Katha and lectures, it is proposed to conduct an online certificate course on Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy and relevance in collaboration with the Indian Missions. This will be stepping further in enhancing the understanding of the participants to get acquainted with the philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi and their relevance in the contemporary world. This will also reinforce that while Gandhiji's contribution during the century of his life was great indeed, his contribution in the next century when the world is facing many challenges could be even higher.

The topics of the course will include peace and nonviolence, satyagraha, transformational leadership, swadeshi and khadi, environmental credo, spirituality and compassion, nature cure and living in harmony with nature, Gandhian economics, and trusteeship.

Course details:

This online course will be of approximately 4 hours duration spread over four weeks (*on Saturdays*) on a virtual platform of Cisco Webex provided by ICCR. The purposed dates are Saturday, 7th May, 14th May, 21st May, and 28th May 2022 at 9:30 PM - 10:30 PM (IST), [Time Zone: 9:30PM (GMT+5:5), 9:00 AM (GMT-7), 10:00AM (GMT-6), 11:00AM (GMT-5) & 12:00Noon (GMT-4)]

The Indian Mission will undertake the publicity and register the participants. The courses will be on a Pro bono basis and will be conducted by Dr Shobhana Radhakrishna and her team. The course will be interactive and participatory. Being a noncredit program, there will be no course end examination.

This online certificate course is aimed at enhancing the understanding of the Indian diaspora and foreign nationals about our spiritual and cultural heritage as well as the tremendous contribution made by Mahatma Gandhi.

After completion of the course, Indian Mission will give the participants a digitally signed Certification of Participation (*signed by Dr Shobhana Radhakrishna and Ambassadors/High Commissioners/ Consul General of respective countries/mission*) and will be given to the participants through digital transmission or distributed in an event.

Broad topics to be covered in four courses:

- Gandhian Philosophy of Truth, Non-violence, Sarvodaya, Satyagraha and Swaraj
- Transformational Leadership of Mahatma Gandhi, Gandhian Economics of Trusteeship
- Mahatma Gandhi's Spirituality, Wellness, Nature cure and Environmental credo
- Mahatma Gandhi's Ashrams, Khadi, Charkha, Swadeshi and Minimalistic living

The suggestions from the Indian Missions will also invite diaspora-led Social Organizations, ICCs and Hindi Chairs of ICCR, local Universities, and Institutes.

It is proposed that the certificate course will cover 6 Indian Missions in May 2022. Each Mission may register 25-30 participants.

From March 2021 to March 2022, we have completed eight online certificate courses hosted by 55 Indian Mission and ICCR. The participants from various countries have wholeheartedly taken part in the classes.

Seventy-four years after Mahatma Gandhi passed on his relevance still matters. His pioneering vision of a non-violent society, sustainable world, religious pluralism, women empowerment, the emancipation of the marginalized, mainstreaming the poor, deprived, vulnerable, and above all unity of humankind is needed now even more than ever before. Mahatma Gandhi took a holistic view of human life and wanted all aspects of life - social, economic, and political- to be dovetailed for the creation of a just society.

In a way, Gandhian humanism and its practical application is the way forward in a world that echoes various challenges of the present time. In the celebration of India@75, Mahatma Gandhi acquires a greater significance than ever before. At this crucial juncture, a fresh look at Mahatma Gandhi's ideas and work become indispensable. It is anticipated that the participants will try to contextualize Mahatma Gandhi's teachings by assimilating Gandhian values, vista and vision in their life and mission. The certificate course will create awareness about the life and thoughts of Mahatma Gandhi along with its usefulness in today's world.
