INDIA'S MARITIME INDUSTRY

The Indian maritime sector plays a pivotal role in the economic growth of India. With a vast coastline of more than 7,500 km, India is among the largest maritime countries in the world. Being a part of the world's busiest trade route elevates the economic prominence of India's maritime sector. About 95% of India's foreign trade and 70% of its value takes place through seaways

Today, India is home to 12 major ports, over 200 ports other than major ports, 28 shipyards and a comprehensive hub of diverse maritime service providers.

The event includes an investor summit and an international exhibition to facilitate interaction and collaboration among the Indian and international maritime companies, policy makers, investors, and other stakeholders.




